#### **BACKGROUND & RE-CAP: THE IRAQ DURABLE SOLUTIONS** ARCHITECTURE

The Iraq Durable Solutions architecture is spearheaded by the Durable Solutions Task Force (DSTF), a senior steering committee consisting of UN agencies, donor representatives and NGOs, providing overall strategic direction of the mechanism and engaging in high-level discussions with the national government. To facilitate the varying levels of coordination required to achieve DS outcomes, the DSTF is supported by two additional national-level groups, the Returns Working Group (RWG) and the Durable Solutions Technical Working Group (DSTWG). The RWG, with open membership, has been brought under the DS umbrella, offering a wider platform for information exchange and updates on DS interventions and plans. The DSTWG is a smaller operational & technical platform to design durable solutions tools, programmes and approaches, acting as the main vehicle for steering the operationalization of DS plans in Iraq. The group has been expanded to 30 seats, occupied by representatives from stakeholders including UN, LNGOs, INGOs, working groups, clusters and other entities, as an outcome of a nomination and voting process.

Localized DS planning and implementation is guided by the DSTWG through 8 area-based coordination (ABC) Groups. Groups are steered by focal points, assigned from operational actors in the area, and include any partner who are active in supporting DS interventions for a defined area. The ABCs link closely with the government at local level, via new and existing committees, in recognition of the leading

One and a half years after its establishment, the DS Mechanism in Iraq has in the beginning of 2022: (1) an established architecture (see above), (2) eight area-based coordination mechanisms (ABCs) coordinating more than 1,500 projects implemented by 59 partners worth approximately 500 million USD, (3) eight area-based plans of action covering the eight ABC targeted areas, (4) a DS Strategic and Operational Framework, (5) an analysis of needs and current response covering around 600 villages/towns across Iraq. (6) a strategy and evidelines on how to conduct coordination under the ABCs, (7) a specific Priority Working Group under the UNSDCF including a funding mechanism

- . DSTWG TORs and ABC TORs were endorsed by the
- . DSTWG conducted bilateral discussions with the Iraq IASC, 8 clusters and 3 subclusters to support the humanitarian transition process embers unanimously agreed that DSTWG co-chairs and support group as well as IOM to prepare for review and input by the DSTWG
- . DSTWG invited to present on the cluster discussions and proposals at the June HCT-Donor Retreat
- · ABC focal points completed a survey to identify the challenges face. The survey showed that human resources and funding are the main challenges (time allocated and actual time spent and lack of funding for activities contributing to DS for NGOs). To increase the level of support for ABC focal points, following endorsement by DSTF National DSTWG released a call for applications for a 3rd focal point position in all ABC groups which had 2 focal points. Each ABC group now has 3 focal points, with a blend of NGOs and UN agencies leading the groups.
- · Following the recommendations of the HCT and endorsement of the DSTF ABCs opened for new members. The call for new members received a high response, with the number of ABC members increased, totalling the overall implementing partners under the ABCs from 59 to 71. For example, ABC Mosul increased from 18 to 43 members, ABC Sinjar increased from 16 to 28 members, and ABC East Anbar increased from 13 to 24 members. The opening of the ABC groups also notably increased the NGO representation across the ABC groups, with the addition of many local NGOs due to their local expertise to be shared with the ABC groups.
- ABC Groups have finalized ABC Coordination in Practice (deep-dive) documents for the following locations, highlighting community-based sectoral needs, current response as well as gaps as a basis for future joint planning. Tal Banat and Tal Ossab (ABC Siniar), Al-Garma (ABC E Anbar), Risala/Sakar Complexes (ABC Ba'aj), Sinsil (ABC Diyala), Al Siniya (ABC SAD), Al-Murra (Hawija ABC). All finalized deep-dive documents can be accessed via this link, then ravigating to the relevant ABC group.


