## DSTWG sub-group: Livelihoods



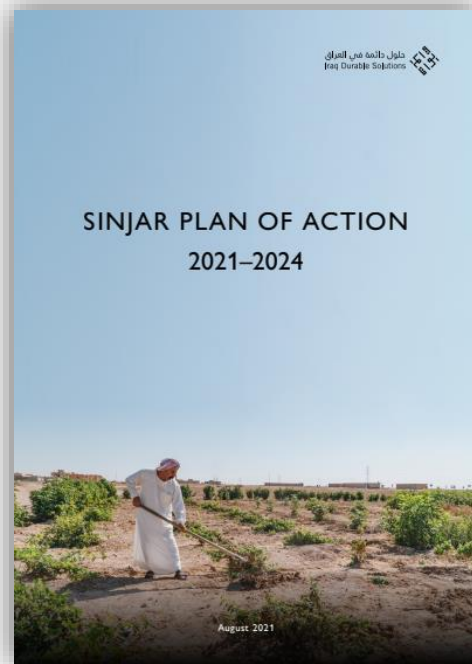
## Rationale

- The need for technical guidance and tools for sustainable livelihoods.** Guidance and tools for livelihood actors (both ABCs and non-ABC), mapping. Technical guidance would also include guidance on targeting from a DS perspective, engagement with government on issues such as registration of businesses, the informal economy (economic/financial inclusion), taxation, social protection for citizens.
- Provide a forum for livelihood actors on best practices and lessons learned** which will include partners across the humanitarian, stabilization, recovery, peacebuilding and development spectrum working on livelihoods, (NGOs and UN agencies).



## Initiation of DSTWG sub-groups (DSTWG TORs)

- It is recognized that time-bound, task based, smaller technical groups (or “sub-groups”) may be convened to develop guidance and approaches to specific thematic areas – such as assessment methodologies and developing guidelines relating to livelihoods interventions, shelter activities or social cohesion. These groups will be initiated as required. The DSTWG will endorse and lead the review of terms of references for relevant DSTWG sub-groups.

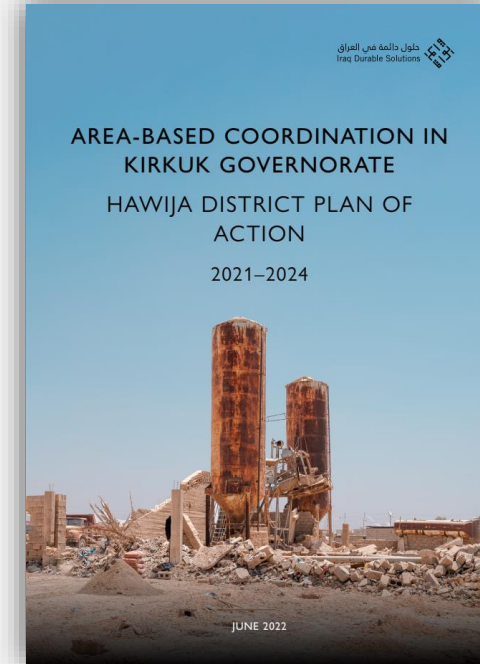

# Transition – brief on outcome of HCT/Donor Retreat and next steps



**Presented on** discussions with the clusters, challenges (approaches, DS goals/Humanitarian goals, government engagement), flexibility within the DS structure

## **Recommendations**

### **•Operational linkages between Sectors/DS**

Recognition of the need for clear operational linkages between remaining humanitarian activities and the longer-term stabilization and development activities. Improving these linkages require ABCs that are fit for purpose to properly coordinate the multi-sectoral needs of conflict affected communities

### **•Funding:**

Fund or support the fundraising of full-time ABC focal points to be hosted by current focal point agencies. There is a current mismatch between demands and time available. Important that at least one focal point per ABC or every two ABCs is fully dedicated to this function.

•NGO funding question needs to be addressed



## Next steps

- **Inclusion of Cluster Focal Points into the ABC membership**

To be flagged with DSTF to amend TORs if necessary.

- **Continued advocacy with DSTF for** dedicated and funded positions for the ABC focal point positions/technical support at the DSTWG level (IM etc)

- **Discussion with OCHA and DSO:**

On attempt to consolidate meetings, ie one nexus coordination mechanism (gov ICCG,GCM, ABCs ) at the district level and the governorate level by end of 2022.

- Outstanding issues: ABCs in KRI
