

Protection Monitoring System – highlights round six (May-June)

The dashboard for the **Protection Monitoring System** has been updated with the results from the **6th Round of data collection (Second Round of 2022)**, which was conducted from May - June 2022. It can be accessed on the following <u>link</u>.

In this round 2422 (1,720 male and 700 female) KI informants were assessed by 11 organizations in 18 governorates, 75 districts and 132 sub-districts.

Key highlights here below:

Safety and Security

- 8% of KIs report that presence of armed and security actors is the main security issue among communities (highest in Anbar with 20% and SAD 10%) and 4% of KIs report destruction of civilian property caused by armed actors as the second main issue (highest in SAD 19% and Diyala 10%).
- 18% of KIs report that safety and security incidents involving armed or security actors happen sometimes or frequently -Frequency of incidents reportedly the highest in SAD (32%), Anbar (25%) and Baghdad (21%).

Right to life and integrity

 13% of KIs reported theft and robbery are the main security issues of violence against civilians (highest in Kerbala 55 % and Anbar with 43%) and 12% of KIs report that mistreatment including verbal and/or physical assault (highest in SAD 31% and Anbar 28%) as second main issue.

• 15% of KIs report that violations of the right to life and physical integrity against civilians occur sometimes or frequently - Frequency of rights-violations reportedly the highest in SAD (29%), Kerbala (25%), and Diyala (20%).

Freedom of movement

• 24% of KIs report restrictions on freedom of movement to other districts/governorates - Severity of restrictions on movement reportedly the highest in Wassit (82%), Diyala and Kerbala (40%), and Anbar (35%).

Access to civil documentation

 52% of KIs report that some or most people are facing issues to obtain or renew their civil documentation - Prevalence of issues related to civil documentation reportedly the highest in Kerbala (95%), Wassit (74%), Anbar (71%), Erbil (70%), and Suleymaniah (67%).

Social cohesion

• 18% of KIs report that social tensions and conflict occur sometimes or frequently - Frequency of social tensions and conflict reportedly the highest in Kerbala (95%), SAD (30%), Anbar (20%), and Ninewa (15%).

HLP issues

• 44% of KIs report that some or most people face HLP issues - Prevalence of HLP issues reportedly the highest in Kerbala /Babil (100%), Wassit (74%), SAD (62%), Anbar (60%), and Diyala (59%).

GBV and CP

- 30% of KIs assess the protection situation of women as negative Severity of protection issues affecting women and girls reportedly the highest in Najaf and Babil (100%), Wassit (64%), Anbar (53%), SAD and Diyala (47%).
- 28% of KIs assess the protection situation of children as negative Severity of protection issues affecting children reportedly the highest in Babil/Najaf (100%), Wassit (64%), Baghdad (58%), and Anbar (43%).
