

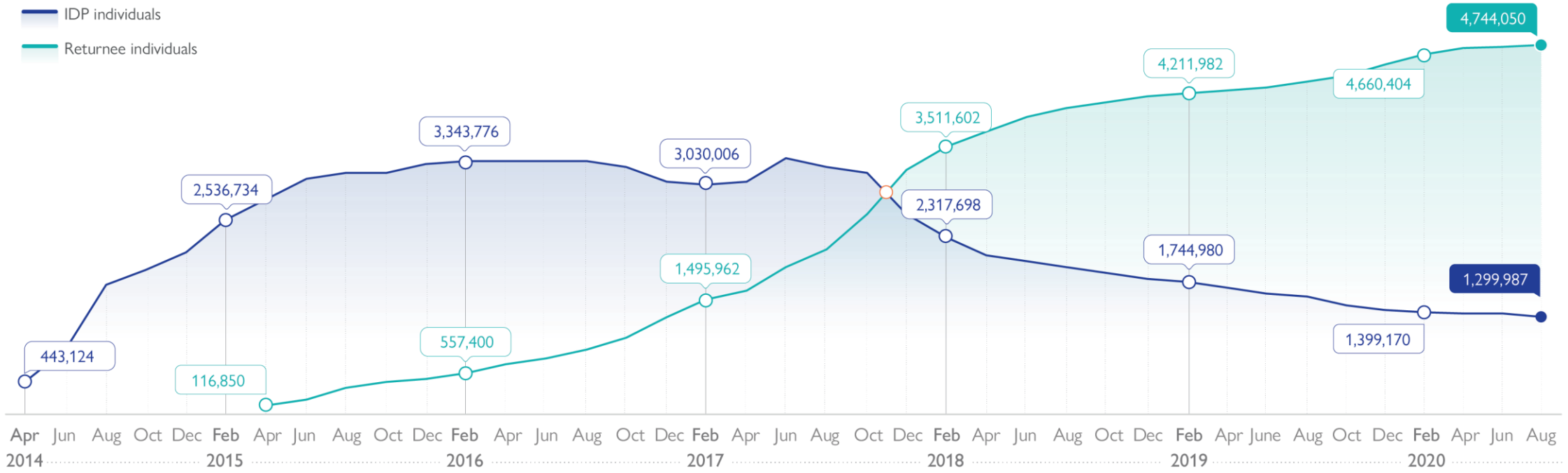

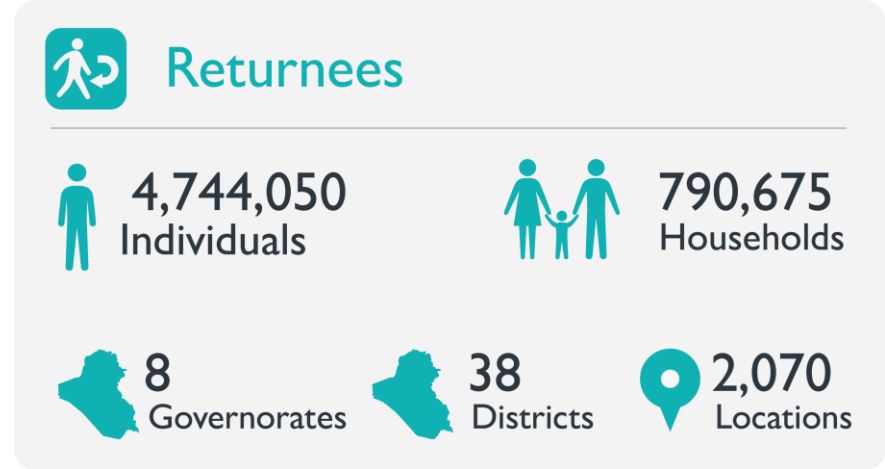
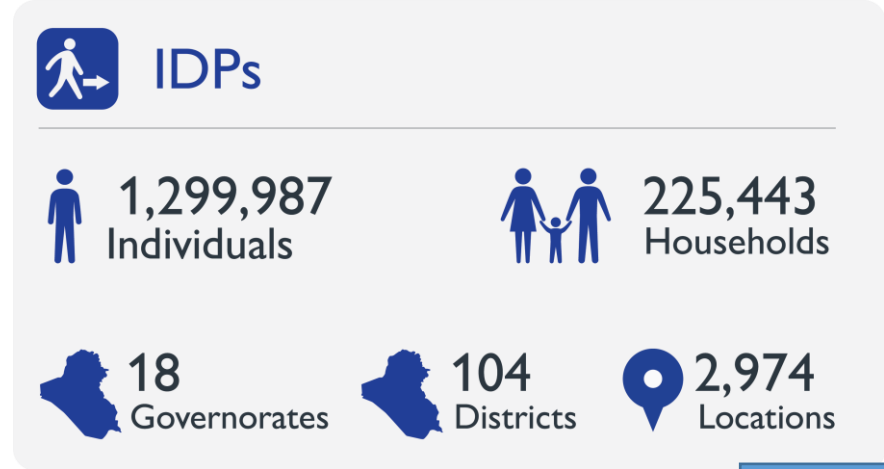

Latest Displacement Data (July-August 2020)



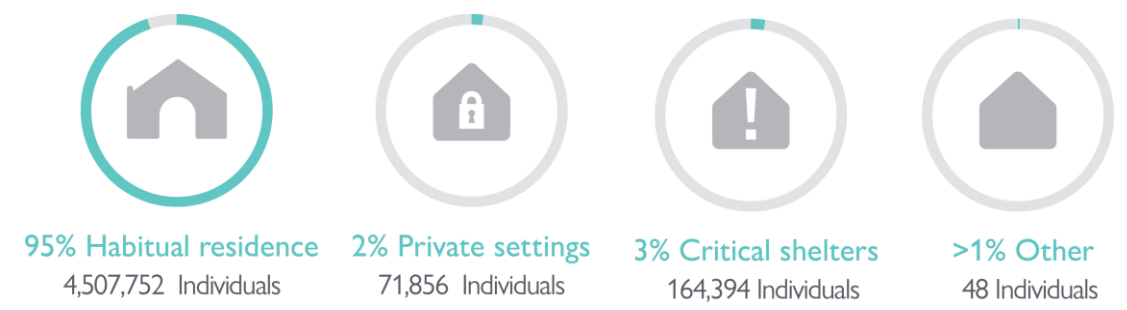
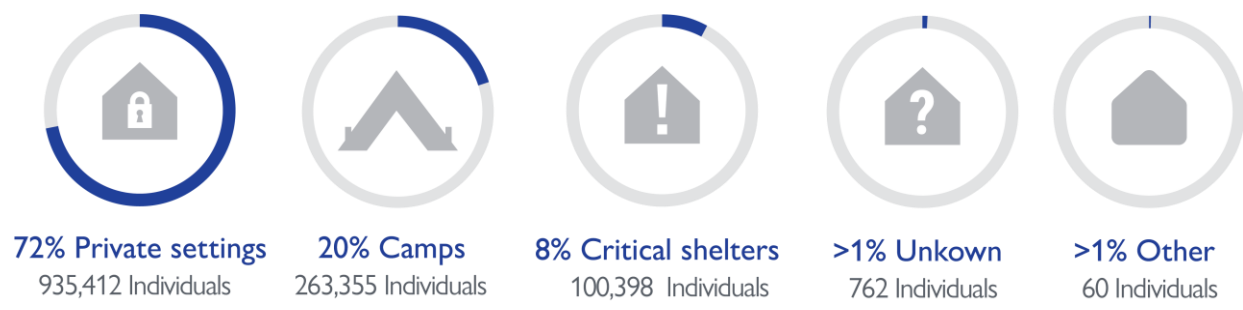

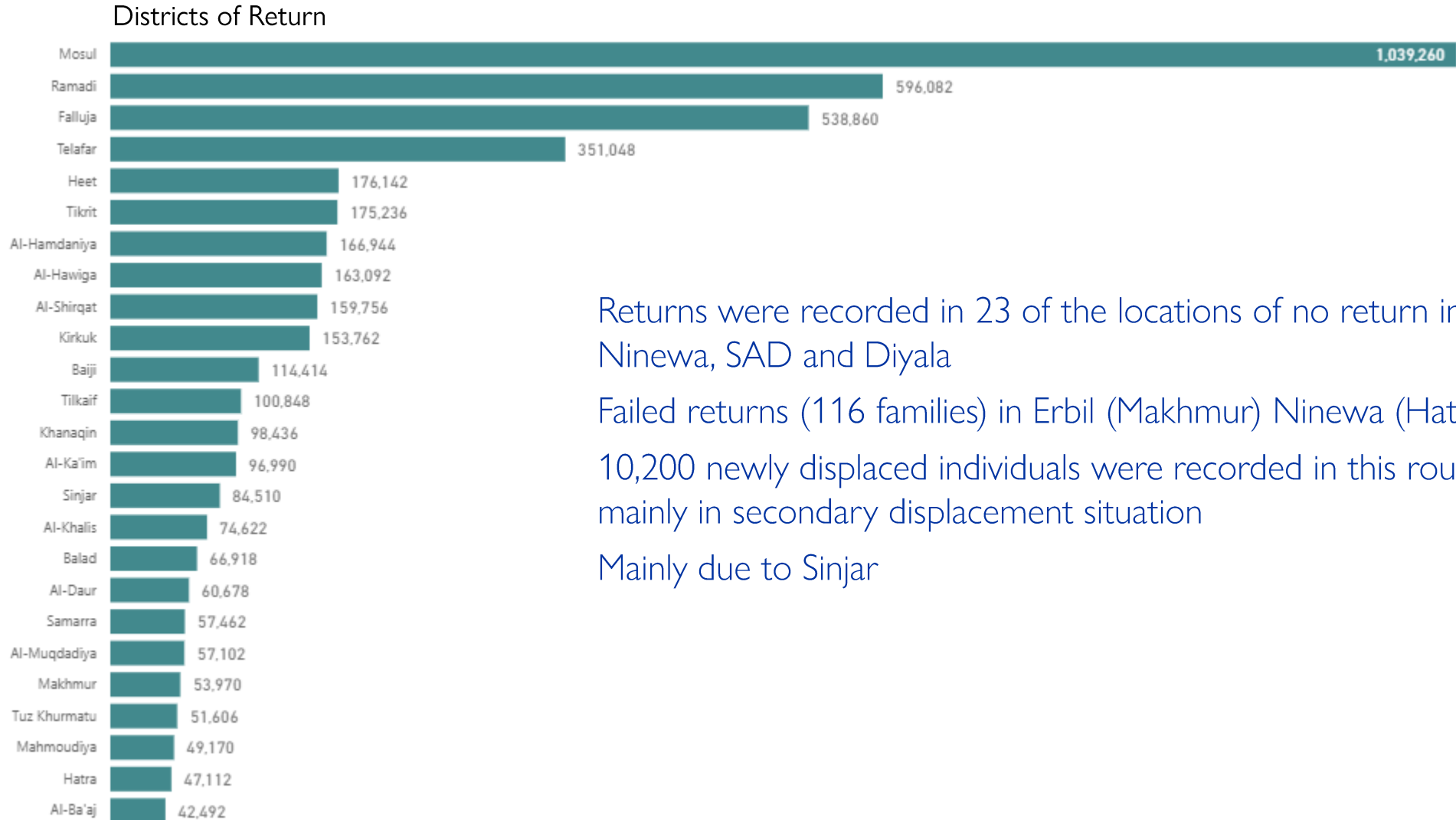

Additional Details- Latest Round

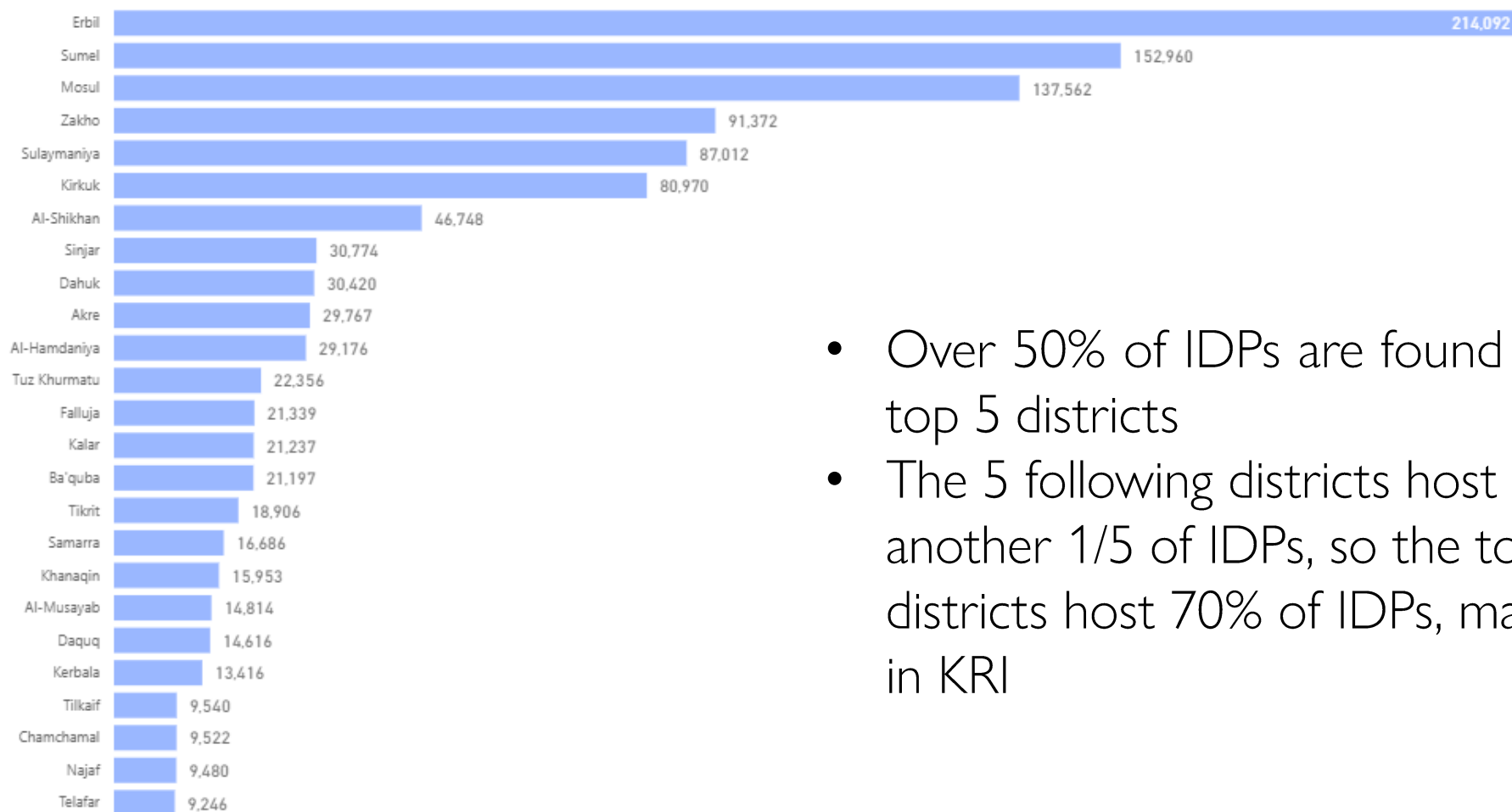


Returns were recorded in 23 of the locations of no return in Ninewa, SAD and Diyala

Failed returns (116 families) in Erbil (Makhmur) Ninewa (Hatra)
10,200 newly displaced individuals were recorded in this round,
mainly in secondary displacement situation

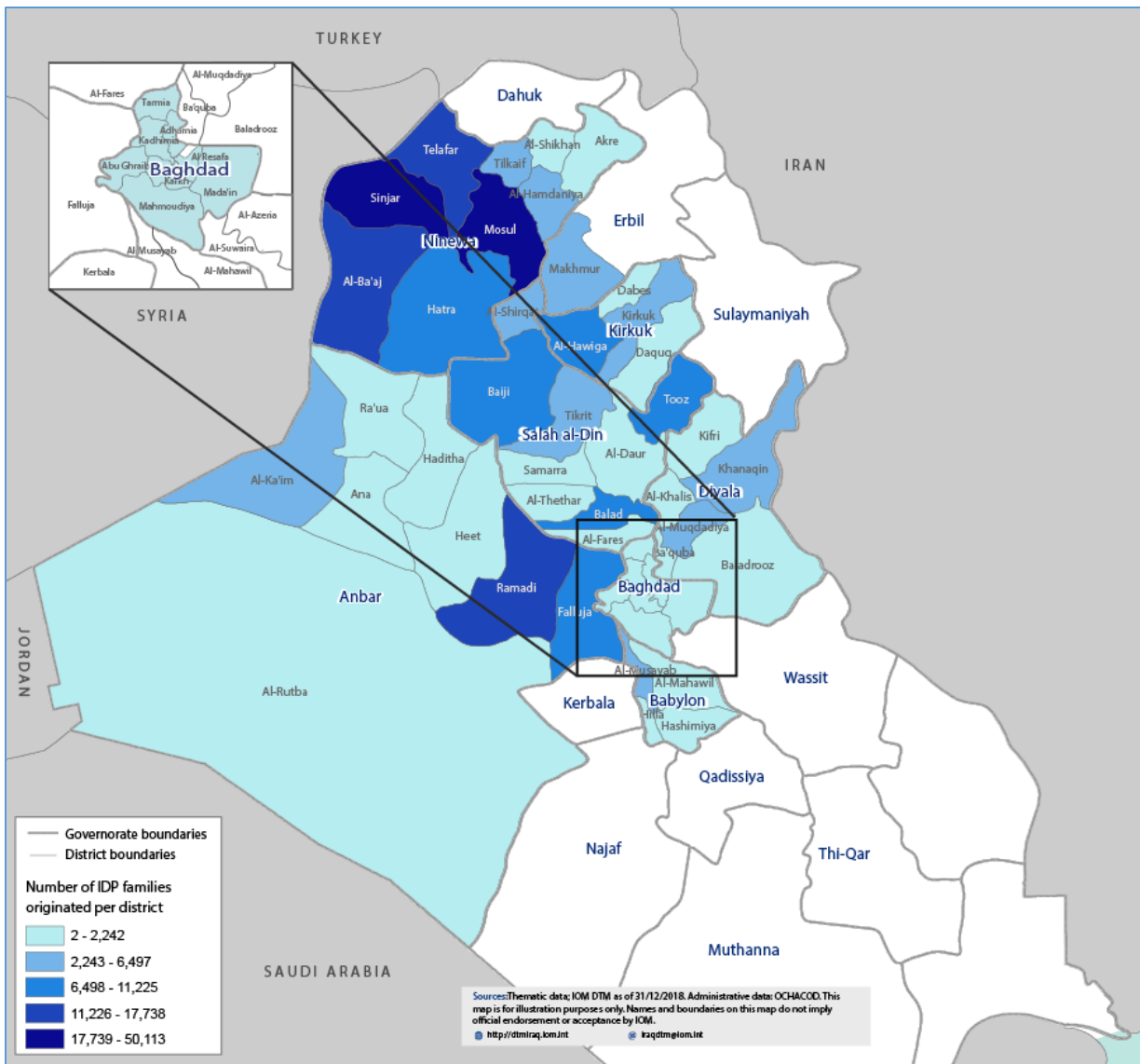

Districts of Displacement

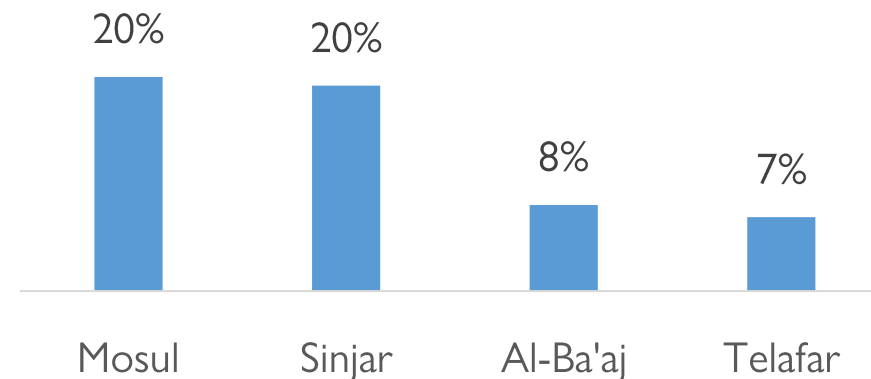


- Over 50% of IDPs are found in the top 5 districts
- The 5 following districts host another 1/5 of IDPs, so the top 10 districts host 70% of IDPs, mainly in KRI

IDP Districts of Origin

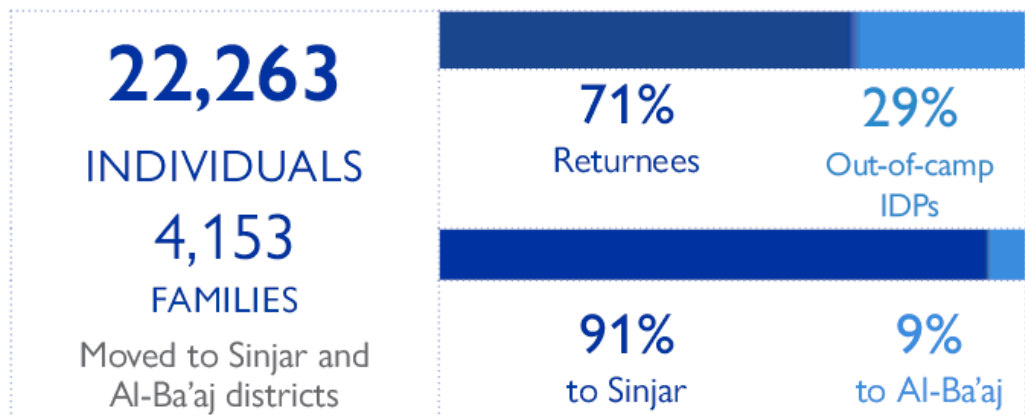


- 60% of IDPs come from Ninewa, mainly Mosul and Sinjar districts which each account for 20% of all IDPs. The 4 Ninewa districts below are the main districts of origin for all IDPs



- Following districts in Ninewa are Hawiga in Kirkuk and Ramadi and Fallujah in Anbar
- At governorate level, the top five districts of origin make up the vast majority of IDPs. In 11 of the 18 governorates, the top five districts of origin account for more than 80% of all IDPs and in the remaining 7 governorates, around 65%.

Sinjar/Ba'aj Movements (8 June-17 Sept)



- Between 2-17 Sept, the average number of daily individual arrivals was 198 to Sinjar and 21 to Al-Ba'aj, which is significantly higher than the daily averages recorded in the month of August.
- Since June 8, Sumel, Zakho and Shikhan have consistently been the main district of departure
- 76% of individuals have come from camps
