


Work Rights – Enabling other Rights



- Decent work is crucial to livelihoods opportunities
- Access to work and decent work conditions facilitates other key rights
 - Central to family income and payment of household expenses including; food, health care, education, utilities
 - Ability to pay rent reduces likelihood of eviction
 - Adequate source of income can reduce protection risks, including risk of child labour
 - Fundamental to human dignity
 - Key to self-reliance and durable solutions
 - Can reduce reliance upon humanitarian aid
 - Acquisition of skills can create other life opportunities

ICLA AND Decent Work



- 1. NRC reached 2,797 (878 F, 1,919 M) individuals with information, counselling and legal assistance on work rights in 2023. Broken down as:
- Information on work rights 1,583 (615 F, 968 M) individuals
- Counselling to 146 (31 F, 115 M); and
- Legal assistance 1,068 (232 F, 836 M)

2. Decent Work Survey Key Findings – KRI

Decent work survey and field experience reveals that:


- 20% formal employment, 50% informal employment, 30% self-employed;
- 55% of refugees did not have sufficient information about their work rights;
- 47% of refugees said that employers respected their rights;

- 87% did not have a written employment contract;
- Only 6% were registered with social insurance whilst only 7% had health coverage through their workplace;
- 14% of respondents reported workplace violations; and
- 10% of respondents took action to protect their work rights.

Purpose of the Guides








- Promote knowledge of and compliance with decent work standards within region


Content of Guides



- Guides cover:
 - Basic work rights, including employment relationship
 - Wages
 - Health, safety and workplace conditions
 - Social security and workplace insurance
 - Working hours
 - Leave Entitlements
 - Tax
 - Dismissal and Termination of Employment
 - Workplace Appeals
 - Special categories including women, youth, daily labourers, part-time or casual employees
 - Work permits for refugees and migrants



Workplace Negotiation Guide




- Majority of refugees in the region are reluctant to take formal action to protect their rights
- Many are working informally and are afraid of losing jobs or having problems with authorities
- Workplace Negotiations Guide is a self-help manual
- Helping workers to improve communication and negotiations skills so that they can get the best possible outcome
- Workers/Project participants will be trained in key skills (2-3 hour training)
 - Developing negotiations techniques
 - Role-plays
 - Learning from each other's experiences and approaches
