# Facilitating Voluntary Movements

## Phase 1

Support displaced people in their decision-making process regarding their preferred solutions

1. Sensitization and registration
2. Coordination with local authorities
3. Go & See and Come & Tell visits



## Phase 2

Facilitate assessment and planning processes to improve conditions in areas of settlement

1. Community level consultation and needs assessment
2. Community implementation plans
3. Kicking-off area-based interventions



## Phase 3

Activities to facilitate safe departures and provision of services

1. Before the day of departure
2. During the day of departure
3. After departure



## Phase 4

Multi-sectoral area-based interventions to support reintegration

1. Supporting access to services and addressing immediate needs
2. Reintegration support modalities and activities
3. Implementation of community implementation plans. Multisectoral area-based interventions
4. Reintegration households and community level monitoring

**over 1,900 individuals** (58% were female headed households).

# Facilitated Voluntary Movements Updates

Last departure details – Jeddah 5 camp

**348 Households** returned/relocated through IOM FVM programme.

**1,722 individuals** (62% were female headed households).

**239 households** returned to their areas of origin (mainly in Ninewa and Salah Al-Din).

**109 households** relocated to other areas (mainly in Ninewa).

Reasons for relocation (concerns in areas of origin)
