Displacement Index


Displacement Index Round 5





- The Displacement Index (DI) is a tool designed to measure and monitor the living conditions of IDPs. Data collection for the DI Round 5 took place between October and December 2022 across 18 governorates, 103 districts and 2,662 locations of Iraq.
- During Round 5, 35 fewer locations of displacement were assessed.

- Out of the 2,662 locations assessed in Round 5, 104 locations present severe conditions. These locations host 5 per cent of the IDP population or 53,826 individuals.
- A decrease of 4,782 IDPs living in severe conditions has been observed since the previous round in July September 2022, when 6 per cent of the IDP population (58,608 individuals) were living in severe conditions.





 - Reduction in IDPs who do not have enough money for food






Hotspots per governorate




Eleven hotspots were identified across five governorates and nine districts in this round.

Subdistricts are classified as 'hotspots' if they score highly in terms of overall severity and have at least 1,000 IDPs residing in the subdistrict. Starting from this round, the list also includes subdistricts with medium overall severity and high score at least on one of the five domains. By applying mentioned methodological adjustment, more hotspots are identified in this round.







Climate Emergency Tracking (March 2023)


- Started in June 2018 in response to worsening drought conditions
- Coverage
 - 10 governorates in Central and Southern Iraq
 - 347 locations assessed, including 82 new locations
- 12,212 families (73,272 individuals) displaced by drought as of March 2023
- Key districts of origin
 - Al-Shatra, Thi-Qar
 - Qal'at Saleh, Missan
 - Afaq, Qadissiya
 - Nassriya, Thi-Qar
- Key districts of displacement
 - Najaf district, Najaf
 - Amara, Missan
 - Al-Shatra, Thi-Qar
- Intradistrict displacement 38%
- Intragovernorate displacement 70%





Climate Emergency Tracking – Trends and Updates


- Shelter
 - Displacement to urban settings 76%
 - 92% in private housing
 - Critical shelters: Afaq, Diwaniya, Hamza, Al-Midaina
- Displacement of returnees
 - Only 0.7% of caseload
- Notes from the field
 - Dependence on agriculture, animal husbandry and fishing as sources of livelihoods
 - Some families reportedly blocked from entering Najaf from other governorates




Number of individuals displaced due to environment factors by year of displacement and governorate of origin: Central Iraq






Number of individuals displaced due to environment factors by year of displacement and governorate of origin: Southern Iraq
