Hasansham Village Inter-agency Assessment Report Findings

Of the 13 villages—this was 1 of 3 which did not have any returns in 2023 when the DSTWG assessment happened.

Largest village of the 13 villages with a population of 1200HH according to government figures.

Recent Update:

266HH have returned to the village in August

Government has committed to supporting some components of infra rehab.





Assessment Report Findings

Sectors

WATER

- Currently water trucking used, WTP used for camps but no network for village
- Ninewa authorities are working on rehabilitating the network

EDUATION

- 2 schools partially damaged one school completely damaged
- Plans

HEALTH

- Plans presented but advocacy needed to obtain budget
- Temporary use of Mosque as PHC

HOUSING

- 80% of housed partial damage
- 20% completely damaged
- Low rate of compensation for damaged property.
