

Facilitated movements in 2023

-During 2023 IOM Durable Solutions has facilitated the return/relocation of **1,520** households displaced in camps, informal sites, and urban areas in Ninewa, Dohuk, Anbar, and Diyala.


- In Duhok IOM has registered total of **4,498** households for facilitated voluntary movement programme.
- In the East Mosul Camps IOM has Registered 616 Households.

Displacement location




Departure plans from Dohuk

- 226 HH participated in the Go&See visits from Kabarto camps and Seje informal site.
- Intention calls were conducted, 198 households confirmed intentions for return.
- Departure is planned for March 12th from Kabarto camps and 13th for Seje informal site.


East Mosul Camps – HasanSham U2

Registered: 344 IDP households


Households Intentions (out of 344)



of households want to return to AoOs or relocate in Mosul (271/306).









East Mosul Camps – Khazer M1

East Mosul Camps

Main challenges

- Time to process the security clearances (process taking over four months and still not approved, and households' pre-conditions and intentions to return or relocate may be negatively affected). Delays in the security clearance process for households in HassanSham U2 and Khazir M1.
- Households from HassanSham village (East Mosul) still not being allowed to return.
- Processes for the security clearance to Khazir villages (East Mosul) perceived as complex.
