

Displacement Overview




- DTM Iraq collects information on IDPs and returnees using a network of key informants across the country.
- A decrease of 18,351 individuals compared to the last round. This
 may be related to the large share living in protracted displacement
 (98%)

Recent movements

- Despite the overall decrease in IDPs across the country, 6,394 new IDP movements were observed during this Round.
- Most of these movements involve IDPs pushed into secondary displacement (93%).
- Failed returns was primarily experienced by individuals who are from Sinjar, Falluja and Al-Ba'aj districts.
- 18 individuals from Salah al Din, Anbar and Diyala were displaced for the first time to Sulaymaniyah.



Return Overview



 An increase compared to the last round, that could be explained by a lack of livelihood opportunities and housing in areas of origin, better safety and security in areas of displacement.










Return Index Round 20 (September – December 2023)



Data Collection Period: September-December 2023

- The Return Index is a tool designed to measure the severity of conditions in locations of return.
- During this round, an additional 17 locations of return were assessed.

Figure 1. Proportion of returnees by category of severity

- Out of the 2,187 return locations assessed, 477 present severe conditions and host 12 per cent of the returnee population, or 604,656 individuals
- Increase of **4,176 returnees** living in severe or poor conditions observed since Round 19

Improvement of conditions

Diyala Governorate

Al-Muqdadyiah and Khanaqin districts

• due to improvement in electricity and water supply (concerns still exist about violence and checkpoints being controlled by other security actors)

Baghdad Governorate

Tarmia District

• due to the improvement in electricity and water supply, (yet the agriculture and businesses recovery is still slow)

Kirkuk Governorate

Al-Hawiga District

• due to the reconstruction of some destroyed houses



Deterioration of conditions

Salah al-Din Governorate

Baiji District

• The start of the new academic year and the poor living conditions in the displacement areas

Ninewa Governorate

Al-Ba'aj District

• Poor access to employment and government services, insufficient water supply in Al-Qahtaniya subdistrict and concerns about violence and checkpoints being controlled by other security actors in Markaz Al-Ba'aj

Al-Hamdaniya District

insufficient electricity supply, housing destruction and lack of employment opportunities

Anbar Governorate

Heet District

• return of individuals (mostly from Erbil and Jeddah camp) after having received security clearance



Map 1. Returnee population density by overall severity score










Displacement Index Round 8



Data collected: September – December 2023

- The Displacement Index (DI) is a tool designed to measure and monitor the living conditions of IDPs.
- During this round, 33 fewer locations of displacement were assessed compared to the previous round as IDPs either returned to their areas of origin or moved to another location of displacement.

Figure 1: Proportion of IDPs by category of severity

- Out of the 2,581 locations assessed in Round 8, 106 locations present severe conditions. These locations host 6 per cent of the IDP population, or 56,250 individuals.
- A decrease of 7,962 IDPs living in severe conditions has been observed since round 7, when 7 per cent of the IDP population were living in severe conditions.

Improvement of conditions

During this round 8 (September - December 2023) there was a decrease of 7,962 IDPs living in severe conditions. This was due to improved conditions in two governorates, where locations comprising 4,866 IDPs in Salah Al-Din and 906 IDPs in Anbar were no longer classified as severe.

Salah al-Din Governorate

Tikrit district

• the improvement of the water supply, thanks to extended hours of electricity supply to water projects, and the improvement of electrical current provision. In addition to the beginning of the new academic year and the incentive to repoyate their houses

Anbar governorate

Ramadi District

• positive impact of IOM's Facilitated Voluntary Movement program, which aids in facilitating the return of IDPs to their areas of origin and some IDPs had completed the rehabilitation of homes in their areas of origin, further contributing to the increase in returns.





Salah al-Din Governorate

Tikrit district

- while services have improved, the situation regarding livelihoods, housing, safety and other issues has remained unchanged from the previous round.
- some families, who reported being unable to afford rent and were reliant on aid, are opting to return to their original areas of origin.






Hotspots per governorate

Twelve hotspots were identified across five governorates. The top three hotspots based on the highest number of IDP residents are Markaz Sinjar in Ninewa, Markaz Samarra in Salah al-Din and Al-Amirya in Anbar governorate. This round, Markaz Abu Ghraib in Baghdad was removed from the list of hotspots.


Emergency Tracking Data: Camp Departures



Total Camp Departures

816 Households 3,493 Individuals

- DTM recorded the departure of 816 households (3,493 individuals) from camps between the 1 and 25 of April 2024 following the recent closure of some camps.
- Most departures have taken place in Sulaymaniyah (422 households), Ninewa (252) and Dohuk (106) governorates.





Emergency Tracking Data: Arrivals




Total Arrivals From Camps

581 Households

1,316 Individuals

- On the 25th of April 2024, DTM recorded the Arrival of 581 households from camps mostly to Ninewa Governorate (303 households) and Salah al-Din Governorate (277 households) and 1 family arrived at Baghdad Governorate.
- Out of these 581 households, **75% have returned to the place where they used to reside** before the 2014-2017 crisis and **25% are still internally displaced persons (IDPs).**
