WS CoP ToR

Main Objectives:

In order to prepare for the potential impacts of continually decreased rainfall and mounting water scarcity, ACF and REACH Initiative are activating a Water Scarcity "Community of Practice" to coordinate water scarcity preparedness and response capacities across Federal Iraq and KRI, connecting stakeholders across the response spectrum (national - sub-national – community levels).

ToR-Roles and Responsibilities

ACF:

- Coordinate the WS CoP meetings / trainings, planning for and sharing agendas, mobilizing participation as well as circulating meeting follow-ups
- ➤ Design, conduct, and coordinate technical capacity building program based on partner capacity assessment.
- > Consolidate and share practitioner toolkit and learning brief
- ➤ Regularly solicit and reflect partner feedback in WS CoP approaches including ToR focus as well as exit/handover planning





ToR-Roles and Responsibilities

REACH Initiative:

- > Deploy and evaluate data from the partner capacity assessment.
- ➤ Design, deploy and regularly update the water scarcity monitoring and anticipatory dashboard.
- ➤ Collect and/or collate key data from partners to input into dashboard





ToR-Roles and Responsibilities

WS CoP Members:

- ➤ Member agency to nominate 1 focal point (and one backup)
- ➤ To actively participate in both the online platform and hybrid training/coordination, and meetings
- ➤ Adopt agreed assessment tools and support in feeding the online dashboard
- ➤ Support in the identification of key potential advocacy points
