

IRAQ RWG 2024 Review Survey Findings

January 2025




- A total of 19 respondents completed the survey.
- The majority are active in the governorates of Ninewa, Erbil, and Duhok.
- Less active areas include Thi Qar and Babil.








- The majority of respondents work for International NGOs (8), followed closely by those from National NGOs (7).
- Fewer respondents represent UN agencies (3), donor organizations (2), and government entities (1).





Key Strengths

- Effective information sharing on returnees, IDPs, and return locations.
- Strong coordination among actors (government, NGOs, UN) and regular partner updates.
- **High satisfaction** with training, capacity building, and durable solutions support.
- Appreciated communication efforts (minutes, emails, updates) and joint products like the Areas of No Return report.
- Regular meetings are valued, with RWG seen as the primary coordination platform in the absence of others.





Key Suggestions, Concerns, and Areas for Improvement

Suggestions:

- Include Iraqi returnees from Europe and beyond.
- Share return-related links for easier NGO access and attach them to meeting minutes.
- Provide more detailed analyses of conflict dynamics, reintegration, and IDP perspectives.
- Develop a service map platform to enhance coordination and address gaps.

Challenges:

- Timeliness of information circulation needs improvement.
- Mixed feedback on collaboration, displacement resolution, and field updates.
