Update on government committees



- Date Established: 28 Nov 2024
- Specialized National Team: Chaired by the Deputy National Security Advisor
- Members: Representatives from Federal & KRG authorities
- Mandate: Develop a plan for displaced persons' return and reconstruction, in coordination with the UN in Iraq.
- o Timeline: 90 days to finalize, with a potential extension in partnership with the UN.

Guidance on Solutions to Internal Displacement (2025)



- Legacy Document: Builds on the Piper mandate and serves as the UN's foundational reference for internal displacement solutions.
- Key Emphasis: Government ownership, with RC/UNCT leadership supported by UNDP, UNHCR, and IOM as Solutions Champions.
- New Arrangements: Introduces the Global Solutions Hub, Solutions Fund, and UN Solutions
 Adviser Facility for cohesive, development-focused approaches.
- Principles: Focuses on quiet diplomacy, evidence-based planning, and inclusive processes that prioritize the rights and agency of IDPs.
- Leadership Rotation: UNDP, UNHCR, and IOM serve as rotating chairs.
